Hungary and its Neighbours After the 2006 Elections

Mr. Kéri is a political scientist and senior researcher at the Hungarian Institute for Political Science. His area of specialization relates to development and change in the multiparty system in Hungary, as well as political culture and political socialization in the transition period.

Mr. Kéri will provide a detailed analysis of political developments in Hungary since the most recent general election of April 2006. He will explore reasons for continuing patterns of policy conflict and political polarization, as well as their impact on the government's ability or inability to deliver on election promises. By placing the Hungarian experience in a comparative perspective in relation to recent political developments in the other Visegrad countries (Czech Republic, Slovakia and Poland), he will explore the degree to which these countries face common political challenges.
