Prof. Krisztina Morvai is an internationally recognized expert of Criminal Justice, focusing on various aspects of human rights, such as violence within families, victim's rights or women's rights. She is a former member of CEDAW, United Nations' human rights committee on women's rights, served on the European Human Rights Committee in Strasbourg and held a Fulbright Educator's Scholarship in the United States.

In her talk, Prof. Morvai will examine the Criminal Justice aspects of the mass police brutalities and human rights violations, which occurred during the Fall 2006 demonstrations in Budapest. The political atmosphere leading to the events as well as the appearance of “moral panic” and “victim blaming behaviour” as psychological phenomena will be examined by Prof. Morvai and her colleagues from the Committee of Civil Jurists.
